Dear North Dakota Hereford Breeders,

As we wrap up 2022 it is very refreshing to see some much-needed drought relief across a nice part of our territory. Although we are still noticing reduced cow numbers across the territory, we have witnessed some very strong feeder calf prices through the summer video sale season, as well as into the fall run. I believe as we look forward to the cowherd rebuild, we have a major opportunity to restock the country with white faced cattle.

We just finished up a very successful Annual Meeting. Financially the American Hereford Association had a very good year, with steady registrations and transfers even with such a widespread drought. I would like to encourage our members from North Dakota to get the 2023 Annual meeting on their schedule. This is a great opportunity to let your voice be heard on a national level, as well as take in the great educational seminars and meet with other Hereford breeders from across the country.

For the fiscal year 2021 we saw extremely good demand Hereford bulls across territory 2, with an increase in demand across the commercial industry. We had 1,395 bulls' market through Hereford World sales that averaged \$7,891. Interesting enough we marketed 100 more bull from 2020 with an increase in the average. My hat is off to the breeders across the territory on such a successful year.

As we look ahead to the upcoming sale season, I would strongly encourage our breeders to stay aggressive at marketing your cattle. Along with our expanding mailing list for our Hereford World publication, I would encourage our breeders to look at utilizing our specific mailing lists, as well as our digital campaigns. 2021 NDHA ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

Friday, December 4, 2021 | Valley City, ND

Carl Olson called the meeting to order. The Secretary's Report from the 2020 Annual meeting was in the November 2021 newsletter. Zac Tessier made motion to approve the Secretary's Report and 2nd by Steve Wolff. Motion carried. Joana handed out the Treasurer's Report and reviewed with the members in attendance. Motion made to accept and 2nd by Steve Wolff – motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The 2021 NSC heifer is donated by Tessier Ranch, Belfield, ND. Thank you to Zac and family for their generosity. We will be looking for a 2021 heifer donor.

The NDHA awarded 3 - \$250 Hereford grants and Larry and Richard Tinjum awarded a \$500 heifer grant in memory of Andrew Dosch to juniors applying to be used in the 2021 NSC Hereford Sale. Thank you to the Tinjum's – this is their 5th yr offering the grant.

Discussion was held on the NSC Hereford Sale – we really need a few more entries than what we have had in the last 2 years. There was discussion on the timing of selling the heifer donation tickets. Steve Wolff made motion to offer pre-sale tickets and sell the tickets at the conclusion of the Hereford Sale and the drawing immediately following. Dan Donnelly 2nd. Motion carried.

Dan Donnelly mentioned that he was approached by some MN Hereford breeders about combining the MN/ND Hereford Sales due to the increasing costs they are incurring for the Gopher Sale. They would like to do a one day event with activities for the juniors and include the adult assn. Maybe include the annual meeting/picnic. The NDJHA is currently looking for a junior advisor/advisors as well. Motion was made by Jeff White and 2nd by Zac Tessier to refer to the Board. Motion carried.

Radio advertising was discussed if any changes to be made for 2022. Steve Wolff made motion to continue and 2nd by Zac Tessier. Motion carried.
